Language used for the training: English.

Target group: kindergarten teachers, pre-school teachers, primary teachers, secondary teachers, headmasters, deputy heads, future head teachers, trainers, councilors, researchers, politicians and other stakeholders.

Description: The Outdoor Education is one of the most important education approaches in European context. If there were any doubts, the covid-19 pandemic reinforced the urgency of schools and teachers to look at activities in nature as an adequate way to teach and learn curricular subjects.

The course has been designed to provide tools to prepare European teachers for a future that happens today, where activities outside the formal classroom will increasingly become part of the school live. The topics and training activities consider the Key Competences for 21st Century Students. The course is designed to be very practical, demonstrative, and interactive. The trainers are enthusiastic educational agents, namely teachers with broad experience and actively involved in Outdoor Education and 21st Century Skills.

Course Objectives:

- Promote debate on Outdoor Education and Key Competences for 21st Century Citizens.
- Understand the learning opportunities offered by outdoors.
- Learn to read the natural contexts in terms of learning opportunities.
- Understand how to integrate outdoor activities in the curriculum subjects.
- Experiment and develop new learning practices and teaching methods.
- Promote interdisciplinary work through outdoor activities.
- Promote a deeper understanding of the practical ways of incorporating Outdoor Education in teaching.
- Improve educational practices through collaborative working approaches among teachers.
- Increase knowledge of social, linguistic, and cultural issues.

- What will you need to teach, instruct or lead outdoor learning?
- Spaces/environments for outdoor activities.
- Tools and strategies to be used in outdoor activities.
- STEAM activities outside the classroom.

Outdoor space safe and organized in a wide-open green space, parks, sand areas, rivers, wooded areas, gardens etc. How to design, plan and implement outdoor education activities The role of reflection, adjusting and evaluation practice in outdoor education. How to integrate curriculum development and achieve personal/group development in outdoor education.

4th day

AM	 Outdoor Activities. Exp: outdoor sports, adventures, nature, expeditions, field studies, curriculum, play, initiative and group tasks, challenge courses, forest schools, arts, etc. Planning outdoor activities. Project work. Participants have space and time to plan outdoor activities, connected with their learning objectives.
